The Shoshonean Reunions were initially organized to bring the Shoshonean/Numic speaking tribes together to revive, promote, and share, as our ancestors did, our tribal progress, language, and cultural preservation programs from each of our native communities. Through these reunions, we have learned so much from our elders, tribal speakers, programs and individuals about our history, traditions and culture. It is with this continuing goal in mind that we invite you to attend the next Shoshonean Reunion XIII to be held in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, on July 18-22- 2012, co-hosted by the Shoshone Bannock Tribe of Fort Hall, Idaho and the Eastern Shoshone Tribe of Fort Washakie, Wyoming.

WHO: Registration is open to all Native Americans with emphasis on the Shoshonean/Numic speaking tribes. Please list everyone in your registration party including children. We encourage participation by children who are learning about our cultural traditions and language. Remember, our children are our future.

REGISTRATION FORMS: We are expecting many people to attend this gathering and we are encouraging everyone to fill out the registration forms. This will be an immense help to us in planning and preparing meals. A reception will be held 6:00 pm on Wednesday July 18, 2012 at the Snow King Resort, Grand View Lodge, Jackson Hole, Wyoming, for early registration. Forms are **due by June 30, 2012.**

LOCATION: The City of Jackson Hole is located in northwestern Wyoming, near the Idaho border, on Highway 26. It can be reached by most Airlines from Salt Lake City, Utah or Idaho Falls, Idaho. There is also Greyhound access since Jackson is a major tourist town. Jackson Hole is 90 miles from Idaho Falls on Highway 26, and is accessible from Salt Lake City but is further. Salt Lake Express also provides service to Jackson, Wy.

All events will begin each day at the Grand View Lodge, Snow King Resort located in downtown Jackson Hole. All events scheduled will be at the Grand View Lodge, Snow King Resort in Jackson. We will schedule two (2) bus tours for significant cultural and sacred sites within the Grand Teton National Park on July 18th and on July 22nd. Please indicate on the registration form so we know how many tour buses we will need. We are working on getting the bus transportation for the tours but will need the numbers of participants.

AIR TRAVEL: If you choose to fly, there are flights daily to Idaho Falls, Idaho, and to Salt Lake City, UT. The Jackson Airport is also serviced daily by an Airline.

LODGING/CAMPING: We have reserved 150 Campsites at the Gros Ventre Campground and will be issued through the registration forms. 100 rooms at the Snow King Resort have also been reserved for Tribes under a first come, first served basis. Once these are taken, rooms will be extremely hard to obtain. The price for the rooms will be \$185 per night. These room rates were negotiated with the Snow King Resort and will be the lowest rate in Jackson during the peak tourist season. There are other camping sites and motel rooms around Jackson, but these would have to be reserved and obtained on an individual basis.

WEATHER: The weather in Jackson Hole, Wyoming is usually warm in the daytime, but cooler at night. Activities at the Gros Ventre Campground will be outdoors and you will definitely need a jacket for the outside events. For the events held at the Amphitheatre will be outdoors, please bring lawn chairs, if possible. Remember, the evenings are cool so be prepared. More info will be provided in registration packets.

FOOD: We will be serving lunch and dinner meals for all who pre-register. Those who register will be served first; however, we can't guarantee meals or snacks for those who do not register.

- Breakfast will be on your own. There may be a continental style breakfast but that will depend on the location of the event.
- A sack lunch will be served on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.
- Dinner will be served at either the Snow King Grand Lodge, or the Gros Ventre Campground , depending on the event sites on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, July 19, 20, 21, 2012.

There are many fast-food and quality restaurants in Jackson. There will be **no** food concessions on any days of the reunion. Bringing snacks and other goodies for your group would be a good idea. Also, we can reduce waste if everyone brings his or her own "Red Solo Cup" or water bottle to be used throughout the Reunion. There will also be food storage instructions at the Campground as Bears do frequent the Campground areas if food is left out. Please contact one of the organizing committees if you have a food donation.

DEMONSTRATIONS: A demonstration of native arts such as beadwork, willow basketry, rawhide, buckskin and native handmade arts will be done between tribal speakers. If you are interested in being a demonstrator, please mark the box in the space provided on the Registration form. Participation of demonstrators will determine the scheduling of whole group or separate workshops. Contact the organizing committee for more information.

VENDORS: At this time, there will be no official vendors allowed, unless it is arranged outside of the SR XIII Reunion. This would be the individual's responsibility. We have not applied for a Vending/ Special Business License for vendors or food concessions.

NATIVE MATERIALS/DISPLAYS/PHOTOS: Each tribe will be assigned one space. There is no charge for native/tribal displays. We encourage you to bring items to share, but we'll have limited space available so each request will receive space, on a first-come basis. Please contact one of the organizing committees to reserve and get assigned a location. If you can bring your own table, it would be most helpful.

VOLUNTEERS: We Need You!! There are a variety of jobs throughout the Reunion that we need help with such as set-up/clean-up, registration, meal preparation, transportation, parking, camping and more! If you'd like to help, please contact one of the organizing committees from either Fort Hall or Fort Washakie. PARADE: A Parade of Tribes is being arranged for Thursday, July 19th as a first event to kick off the reunion through downtown Jackson at 9:00 a.m. We are encouraging all to participate, especially on horseback, floats, and of course walking, and to wear native regalia. We would also like the tribal councils to participate as tribal dignitaries of the parade. NATIVE FASHION SHOW: Is scheduled for Saturday afternoon at 1:00pm. Participants will be showing a range of native traditional to contemporary pow-wow clothing. Participants will be asked to provide a description of their clothing. If you would like to participate, please contact the Sho Ban or Eastern Shoshone Committee. We encourage everyone, especially the youth, to participate.

CULTURAL SHARING: This Reunion will be a cultural sharing of all tribes. Sign-up for participating singing, dance presentations, storytelling & fashion show should be done as soon as possible. That can also be done at the registration table on Wednesday evening and Thursday morning. If you would like to participate in any way that was not mentioned, please feel free to bring your ideas to any local committee, or the Sho Ban committee, and even the Executive Board. We are very open to adding to the program but need information by June 15, 2012 to incorporate it onto the agenda.

WARRIOR'S RUN: We are working on scheduling a Relay Run from both the Fort Washakie Reservation and Fort Hall Reservation to Jackson. More info will be coming.
